#### > Flu vaccinations in school

The nasal influenza vaccination will be offered to children in Reception-year 6 this Autumn term. Parents should have received an email with information on how to consent to this. If you have not submitted your online form please do so using the following link and entering the information below:

- 1. Go to https://www.hdft.nhs.uk/fluconsent/
- 2. Enter the School Code 121632 and click "Find School".
- 3. Complete the form with your child's information and parent/guardian contact information\*.
- 4. Click the green "Submit" button.

#### Village notice

Please can we ask Parents who pick up and drop off in their vehicles that they observe the speed limit in the village? Could we also remind parents not to park on the grass verges in the centre of the village. In particular there's a patch towards the start of Church Lane which is easily damaged once the autumn weather is upon us.

#### Apple picking

Children have been encouraged to collect apples they find around the school grounds and put them in one of the crates that have been left out. Once we have collected enough apples, a member of the village has very kindly offered to come into school to do some apple pressing with the children. So if you find any apples at drop off and pick up please put them in the crates. Thank you!

## National walk to school day – Friday 8<sup>th</sup> October

Schools across the whole district, both secondary and primary, will be swapping their car commute (or at least the last part of it) in favour of walking, cycling or taking the bus/train, as part of a community effort to reduce our district's carbon emissions.

Some pupils who live in rural locations may feel they cannot get to school any other way than with their car, so car sharing and the 'park and stride' option also count.

If parents can park their car sooner than normal, and walk the last part, that still lowers their carbon footprint. Every mile counts!

#### Water bottles

Please can we remind parents that children must bring in a named water bottle, preferably a sports style bottle every day they are in school and these must only contain water.

#### > Children walking/cycling alone to school

Parents of children in Years 5 & 6 may decide that their child is capable of independently walking/cycling to school. If this is the case, then a consent form must be completed for that child and returned to the school office. Attached to this newsletter is the policy and consent form for parents to read through. If your child wishes to ride their bike to school there is a bike rack in the school car park where their bike can be secured during the day. You will need to provide them with a locking device which they can operate themselves.

#### If your child is ill

You need to inform the school office by **9am every day** that your child is unwell and that they will not be in school. If your child is suffering from vomiting/diahorrea then they must stay off school for a full 48 hours after the last occurrence of the illness. We kindly ask that you consider getting a Covid test for your child if they have these symptoms as new variants can display sickness/diahorrea in children.
