# Harlow Class visit to Leeds City Museum

Last week Harlow class went to Leeds City Museum, we had an amazing time exploring the natural world's exhibit as learning about the local history of Leeds. In the afternoon we had a workshop in the 'Ancient Worlds' exhibition in which we learned all about the Ancient Egyptians and their traditions surrounding mummification. We were lucky enough to have a look at a real mummy which is more than 3000 years old! During our workshop we were also able to have a go at mummifying a doll, we placed the insides into the correct canopic jars and learnt about their significance. The adults were really impressed with all of the Ancient Egyptian knowledge the children had and the curiosity they all showed while exploring the museum.
